

\$20 ACCESS TICKETS

Most of the tickets in this programme are \$20, even if they are located in a higher reserve area. For events with a lower ticket cost the lower price will apply. For Choose Your Price events you can select the ticket price that you can afford.

FREE COMPANION SEATS

If you need assistance to attend events in the Access and Inclusion programme, you may be entitled to a free companion ticket. Companion tickets are limited to one per person per performance and are subject to availability. For any friends or whānau attending as a part of the same group who are not d/Deaf or disabled will be charged full price for their tickets.

PHYSICAL ACCESS

All events in our Access and Inclusion programme are accessible to wheelchair users, although wheelchair seating is limited. Designated wheelchair spaces are sold at our Access price of \$20 per ticket or less if the full ticket price is lower.
