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Words from the Directors

I remember that feeling of living outside of life. To be honest I still feel it sometimes. This sense of isolation from other people is a dangerous place to be. It distorts you and how you perceive the world. The solution is connecting with people. But that's not always easy. Thankfully sometimes these connections are forced on us or are accidental. When I think back on my life now there are a handful of people that have changed me forever, people I have loved, or people I have shared a certain experience with. The characters in Mr Red Light are all forced to spend time together. This experience transforms their lives. I do believe there are some people who are brought to this earth as catalysts of change. Their own lives are often a disaster but somehow they change other people's lives for the better, Mr Red Light is such a man. - Carl

The Company

Ben Crowder and Carl Bland are the creative force behind Nightsong, one of New Zealand's most innovative theatre companies. Together they create work that ricochets between the absurd and the profound. They've shot people out of cannons, introduced a life-size giraffe into Bruce Mason's study, and greeted audiences with a gorilla holding an ice-cream. Carl writes the plays and then helps Ben direct. Supported by leading designers and actors, Ben and Carl have been working together for at least 14 years.

Carl Bland Writer and Director

Carl is a writer, actor, director and painter. He wrote and created his own shows with Peta Rutter. Their shows included *The Bed Show, The House* of Doors and Camels, Peta and Carl at the Last Supper, and Sofa Stories.

Collaborating with Ben Crowder, he has also made *Head* and 360 – A *Theatre of Recollections, Spirit House* and *Te Pō*.



Ben Crowder Director

Ben is a talented and respected theatre director and creator, and co-founder of Nightsong. He creates bold theatre that is hallmarked by striking visuals and a sense of thrill – coupled with dramatic integrity. He has directed all of Nightsong's productions since 1999. Past productions include: 360 - A Theatre of Recollections, Head, The Young Baron, The Hunchback of Notre-Dame, A Midsummer Night's Dream and the national tour of Blossom.

Ben also works extensively as a freelance director and creator. He's worked with Auckland Theatre Company, Silo Theatre, Red Leap, Dust Palace and The Edge (now Auckland Live) amongst others. He is often engaged on the development of new works. Recent productions include *Nui Sila, The Man Whose Mother Was a Pirate* and *Famous Flora*.
